The Declaration of Independence-(Original Modern Translation)Side by Side comparisonEt to look modern alone, or original If in the course of human events, it is necessary for one nation to dissolve the political bands that are interconnected, and to take the powers among the earth, a separate and equal station to which the natural and natural God's right requires them to respect the opinions of human activity, so that they declare the reasons that prevent them from being separated. If it is necessary to complete one political process due to a lack of representation, it is fair to list the reasons. We take these truths for granted, that all men are created equal, that their Creator has given them certain inalienable rights, that there is life, freedom, and the pursuit of happiness among them.--We believe that everything is created equal and should be given the right to continue life, freedom, and happiness as they see it. We believe that these rights are the basic truth and no government has the right to cut more now and forever. Since, in order to ensure these rights, governments are created among men based on their legitimate powers on the basis of governing consent, --That if any government begins to destroy these objectives, the people have the right to amend or repeal it and to create a new government, laying the foundations for such principles and arranging their powers as such. , as they are most likely to be and good luck. That governments are created and they get their powers from their own people to protect these rights. And when any government design begins to remove its freedoms, it is the sole responsibility of the people to correct or replace it. Conservatism does indeed dictate that long-established governments should not be changed because of light and transient causes: and therefore, all experience is shredded, that mankind is more willing to suffer, while evil is suffering than by law, eliminating the forms with which they are accustomed. But if a long train of abuses and usurpations, always pursuing the same object evinces design to reduce them under absolute Despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw such government, and to provide new guards for their future security.-Such is the patient suffering in these colonies; and such is the need that forces them to change their former system of government. We should not change the government lightly, because if we do, people will suffer. It is therefore important that in any form of the dominant process we agree, we build it well. However, when conducting any action this governing body is creating, trying to reduce our civil liberties, or reduce our ability to govern ourselves, it is not just our right, it is our civic duty in any real Republic to change or throw out such governments, and to provide a new governing body that supports civil liberties for all, now, and future generations. To enjoy civil liberties, our participation in maintaining our security lands squarely for us, those who live beneath them. The current British king's history has a history of repeated injuries and usurpations, all with the direct aim of creating absolute tyranny over these countries. To prove it, let the facts be presented in a sincere world. Looking at the king's record, it is clear that England wants full control of our colonies, undermining our freedoms. Here are our facts-He has refused his consent laws, the healthiest and necessary for the public to be good. He won't allow us to create our own laws, the basic need to work here. It has prohibited its directors from ing immediate and urgent laws unless

they are suspended from their operations until their consent is given; and when he is so suspended, he has completely failed to take care of them. He's not going to let us pass important laws right now. He has to sign them, and if he doesn't, we'll suffer. He has refused to pass other laws to accommodate large people's neighborhoods, unless these people waive the right of representation in the legislature, a right that is overestimating and frightening only to tyrants. He refused to allow us laws that affect large groups of people in our colonies unless they swore allegiance to him, even though they have had the right to rule for themselves, which clearly shows that he is a tyrant. It has convened legislative bodies inconvenient and far from the repository of its public registers, in order to bring them into line only with its measures. He demands meetings of our representatives in distant cold and strange places to bear their surrender so that they agree with him. He has been repeatedly disbanded because he opposed the masculine certainty of his invasion of human rights. He has divided our leaders as we complain about human rights violations. He has long refused to choose others after such graduation; where legislative powers which are unable to destroy have returned to a wider person in order to exercise them; the country, meanwhile, has been exposed to all the risks of invasion and convulsions. If we do not allow us to rule with any capacity, it will open up our colonies to corruption inside and outside. It has tried to prevent the population of these countries; to this end, to prevent the Naturalisation of Aliens; By refusing to pass others to encourage their migration so far, and to raise the terms of the new appropriations lands. He struggles to control our colonial population, immigration, ownership of land and expansion. He has obstructed justice by refusing his consent to the law for imposing powers of the judiciary. He has made it difficult to practice the law here, wishing himself to be the ultimate judge and jury. He has made judges dependent solely on his will, their tenure and the size and payment of their salaries. He sent over crooks, whom he calls judges, to give up his will through the courts without a court or jury. He's set up a bunch of new offices and so far sent a swarm of officers to harass our people and eat their contents. He's created new offices whose employees beat the business through harassment to enforce their will on us. He has kept the armies standing among us during peace without the consent of our legislators. He sent an army to watch over us when we didn't need them and didn't want them. He has influenced making the military independent of civilian power and condescending from it. He has done everything to make his army bigger than our legal system and our ability to do justice. He is united with others to subject us to a jurisdiction that is within our Constitution and which is not recognized by our laws; Giving his consent to his actions in the sham Legislation: He refuses to recognize our own laws, and tells us that we must abide by his laws instead. The four of us of the great armed forces: breaking up our military to make them vulnerable and controlled. For protecting them, which they would have to do for the punishment they would have to do for the people of these countries: to protect British military personnel who, for some reason, could not go to trial, allowing them to operate outside our own laws. Such as off our trade in all parts of the world: to cut off our trade with other countries. For imposing taxes on us without our consent: to add taxes without our consent. Leaving us in many cases, the benefits of trial by the Jury: Taking away our right to trial the jury in many cases. To drag us out of the seas to be convicted of pret framed crimes. In order to abolish the free English system in a neighboring province, to create an arbitrary government in it, and to expand its borders to immediately, for example, and as an appropriate tool to impose the same absolute rule of law on these colonies: To take us, one of England's provinces, to remove our laws, forcing our own set of laws for us, and extending that border and making it a model for the rule of law that others must follow or else. For withdrawing our charters, abolishing our most valuable laws and changing the forms of our governments: to remove our charters (forms of legislators) that allow us to govern. For stopping our own legislators and investing in power to legitimise us in any case. For stopping our own laws and forcing his own system of justice down our throats. He has renounced the government here, declaring us his defense and entering a war against us. For declaring our government and declaring war on us that we had a desire to govern. He plundered our sea, devastated our coast, burned our cities and destroyed the lives of our people. He's overfished our waters, burned our cities, and destroyed the lives of many people in our colonies. He is at this time transporting large armies of foreign mercenaries to complete the work of death, devastation and tyranny, already begun the circumstances of cruelty & perfidy hardly parallel to the most barbaric eras, and completely unworthy of the leader of a civilized nation. It is at this point that he sends a large army of mercenaries who have no morals to kill and torture everyone now that he has broken our laws by defending the common man. If you think we've been suppressed so far, expect the worst you can imagine. He has forced our fellow citizens to take prisoners on the high seas to carry weapons against their country, to become executioners of their friends and brothers, or to fall into their arms. He is excited among us by the domestic uprisings and trying to bring the inhabitants of our borders, the ruthless Indian savages, whose known rule of warfare is the inconspicuous destruction of all ages, genders and conditions. He has manipulated people and groups in our colony to fight each other, and wants a rule of law similar to those wild Native Americans living in war. under any conditions. (Guerrilla war is probably what they're talking about here because of the war before that was fought face-to-face during the day) At every stage of these oppressions, we have requested re-treatment under the most modest conditions: our repeated petitions have only been answered with repeated injuries. The prince, whose character is therefore characterized by any act that can define a tyrant, is not fit to be the ruler of a free nation. For every action above, we have applied, and have been told in return to suck it up. It's time to stand up for yourself as free people and kick this tyrant out. Nor have we wanted to pay attention to our British brothers. We have warned them from time to time about their legislator's attempts to extend undue jurisdiction over us. We have reminded them of the circumstances of our exodus and settlement. We have turned to their local justice and generosity, and we have charmed them with the bonds of our common tribe, to discontinue these religious affiliations, which would inevitably sever our ties and correspondence. They, too, are deaf to the voice of justice and consanguinity. Therefore, we must come to a close with this need, which condemns our separation and keeps them, as we keep the rest of humanity, our enemies in war, in friends of peace. And we have warned England from time to time, we rule ourselves, reminding England of our own immigration conditions and moving to live here. We asked nicely, but even if we've shown them how it's bad for business for everyone, they just don't listen. So it is up to us to fight for our fundamental rights, and anyone who is opposed to it within or outside our borders is our enemy and anyone who forges to expand civil liberties, our friend. That is why we have assembled the representatives of the United States of America in general congress, we turn to the World Supreme Court for our intentions to be solemnly published by name and by the authority of the good people of these colonies and declare that these American colonies are, and the right should be free and independent states; that they are and should be completely terminated of all allegiance to the British crown and that all political communication between them and the State of Great Britain is and should be completely terminated; and that, as free and independent states, they have the full power to establish war, to conclude peace, to conclude alliances, to establish trade and to do all the other laws and things that independent states may have the right to do. And in support of this declaration, firmly relying on the protection of divine foresight, we pledge to each other our lives, our fortunes, and our sacred Honor. So we, the representatives of the people of these United States of America, gathered here under one roof, proclaiming to the highest judge in the world that we are free. We declare that we are no longer under the rule of the British crown and all political has expired. These Free and Independent United States have the full power of each to build partnerships, do business, go to war, or negotiate peace. The Declaration of Independence was signed by 56 of america's richest and/or brightest colonists, including Button Gwinnett, a recent English immigrant, Lyman Hall, who fought for a federally funded religious university, and George Walton, who was strangely returned to the US after spending two years behind bars in England, somehow seeking death.
